PGIAA Cares

- <u>Care Line</u> Provides 24-7 services (PGIAA trained LMFTs, homeless counseling, temporary shelter and more. Call volume has remained high (60-75 calls weekly). Recently, experienced high volume of student calls. The real needs, we believe, are just beginning to emerge and we are partnering with local community resource groups to include our Care Line. - <u>Care Boxes</u> Care Drops at the mail stations throughout the community will continue as long as food shortage is a concerning with in our community.
- <u>Grief Network</u> The number of deaths has again risen across the board and the need for this service increased significantly.

- <u>The Lummi Nation Red Road To DC</u>, 24 foot Totem Pole Journey. The **totem** is a gift from the Lummis Lhoq'temish (people of the sea) — to Deb Haaland, Secretary of Interior (a member of New Mexico's Laguna Pueblo) and President Joe Biden. Carved from a 400-year-old red cedar tree, the totem will be displayed at the Smithsonian National Museum of the American Indian.


